

Dansville Oct. 29th 1865

Dear Bro. Hare;

Yours of the 17th inst containing the \$20.27 came to hand Friday. Has forwarded to me from Battle Creek. Thank you. The papers you enquire for I sent from Battle Creek to Bro Nicola Richmond Iowa soon after my return to Battle Creek to have him sign them and return immediately to me. They have never reached Battle Creek. I will write to Bro Geo & Butler who made a copy of them to forward a copy to you. That will be the shortest way to come at it till the original documents turn up.

You say you "wish Bro. White would hurry out his answer to the objections." Bro. White is not able to write 6 lines. His nervous system is prostrated, cannot even take upon him the care of himself. But we are in hopes

under the favorable circumstan-  
ces he is placed here, with the bless-  
ing of God, he will be able in  
6 or 8 months to write a little. Not  
few have any idea of his condition.  
He is stronger however than he was  
when he came here in some respects.

What has appeared in Review over  
his signature of late he writes by  
dictating. others doing the writing. <sup>in</sup> this  
way he could not write over a dozen  
lines a day. he is so weak.

I am gaining quite rapidly. am  
in hopes to recover fully in 3 or  
4 months, so as to be strong  
as ever.
