San Francisco, Nov. 5, 1874

Dear Bro. White:

The brethren and sisters in Oakland seem to feel the burden of the work some, and volunteer their services free. Brother Baker does all our carting free. Bro. Tay and Rickey carry forms free. Sisters fold the papers and assist in wrapping free. Brethren Robb and Guile will work at anything we have to do on Sundays free. What wood we use, we get 4 feet, and these brethren cut it free.

I got over 75 reams of paper from San Francisco yesterday, transportation twenty-five cents, delivered at New Office, by employing Brother Baker on the free list.

I have written Clara Morrison to come down and try her hand at typesetting, six months for her board. Several offer to board new beginners cheap on Battle Creek plan. I think the Oakland church look on it as a privilege to have the Press in their midst, and are willing to do what they can to help on the cause.
