Dear Sister White:-

In order that you may know the truth direct from me with reference to my attitude, and the attitude of the Sanitarium, I write this brief note to say to you that I stand, and that we all stand, just as we did when you were here a year ago last September. We have made no change in our attitude, and do not expect to make any change.

The newspapers are talking about controversy. We do not recognize any controversy. We have no battle to fight. We are simply working as hard as we can to take care of the sick folks whom the Lord sends us, and to stand up for the principles of truth which this institution represents. This is the commission the Lord gave me thirty years ago, and I am endeavoring to do my duty in the fear of the Lord. I have taken no stand against you, nor against the Testimonies, nor against the work in general, nor against the truth. I am not going to do so. As long as the Lord permits me to stand at my post here at the Sanitarium to do my duty, I shall endeavor to do it. When the Lord clearly indicates to me that my work is done, I shall cheerfully take up the same work in whatever place the Lord may call me to.

We are doing our utmost to heed all the light which has been sent to us, and to make right every wrong thing, to hold up our principles, and to consecrate ourselves wholly to the service of God and humanity, and to press toward the light as earnestly as we can.
