I have had a great time buying some knit red Wristers There are about six Irish women on deck with all sorts of trinkets and fruit

I bought some handkerchiefs and asked if they had wristers They said no. Then a girl found one and then they searched and ransacked for the other Finally they gave it up. and one of the old women told the girl to sell me the ones she more. But they were too dirty. I preferred a clean pair. But By-and-by a boy came and searched in another tin box and found the other wriester So I got a good pair for 25 cts.
