Mr. Stonewall Jackson, Harris,

Dear Brother:

Since receiving the communication from Mrs. White I wish to hand you in writing my conviction relative to the situation. I believe the communication to be right from Heaven and meet in due season. I will, therefore, have to accept the advice given so timely and in such a good, tender spirit. I will, however, hold myself free to offer any advice or service relative to the Stratton proposition or the oil proposition, provided we can be allowed to use our God-given endowment of intelligence.
